Ladies:

I didn't have enough time at the Pescadero meeting to explain that ranch ownership is one of the strongest bonds that keeps our family together; we hold our annual, extended family reunion here. We've sacrificed to keep the ranch intact, and under our Bylaws, any individual who wishes to sell must first offer his shares to the other owners. No one wants an outsider to disrupt our plans.

As to my first question, the response I received failed to acknowledge that condemnation for public purposes takes property off the tax rolls. The County needs every cent it gets to support sheriff, health and other services for the extensive rural area.

My second question dealt with condemnation. You say you would support our farm operation, but as soon as we request the separate parcel necessary to establish a modest visitor-serving facility, we would become your target.

My third and fourth questions stand.

It should be recognized that families like mine, which have exercised good stewardship for more than 80 years, are already under strict control by the County and Coastal Commission. We don't want to live under the threat of condemnation. It would preclude us from State-encouraged priority uses which would help keep us going during periods of drought or deluge.

- 1) How can a San Mateo County protect the welfare of its residents if an outside agency (MROSD) can erode its property tax base and over ride its Local Coastal Program?
